- The result will be presented in the right hand side of the window.

The code uses `v-show` and `v-if` directives to conditionally render elements. The browser's developer tools are open on the right, showing the DOM structure and highlighting the `v-show` and `v-if` blocks with red circles.

Example: v-show Visibility of Div Element

Find the 'showDiv' data property in the code, change it to 'false', and run the code again.

While v-show hides the text, the v-if destroys the resources in the html-dom
